

Presidents Message

On August 2, the council will have a planning retreat at the synod office. Even as my mind and body gear up for the start of Fall activities, I plan to enjoy the lazy days of August. I hope the same for you.

Members of OSLC council continue in conversation with DEM Tom Goellrich and Bp. Dave Nagler regarding the formation of **Ministry Cooperatives**, a model that is being developed in Pacifica Synod to expand ministry by bringing congregations together to share resources.

By August 31st, a council approved letter of interest will be shared with Bishop Dave and Rev. Tom so that Cooperative Ministries can be created in September. Memorandums of Understanding will be created and signed for each formed Cooperative in October. A Council of Councils will be created in November. This will include members from each of the congregations within a Cooperative who will work together to oversee the functioning of the Ministry Cooperatives. Pastoral Care staff will be selected in November and December with a plan to have Ministry Cooperatives start in January of 2026.

Congregations within a Ministry Cooperative will maintain their autonomy as congregations and will also allow the expansion of mission and ministry. We believe we are stronger together!

As stated in the July newsletter, congregations will share Pastors, Deacons and Synodically Authorized Lay Leaders. If you feel called to lead as a lay leader or know of someone who has the gifts for leadership, we encourage you to lift these people up (metaphorically). The synod office will be organizing ongoing training and mentors for lay leaders in the Ministry Cooperatives.

Please reach out to a council member with any questions or concerns you have with regards to the Ministry Cooperatives. We may not have the answer to your question, but the questions and concerns that are shared early on in the process will be helpful in developing successful Cooperatives.

SOME INFO ABOUT MINISTRY COOPERATIVES

TIMELINE:

AUGUST – Council Approved Letters of Interest
SEPTEMBER – Cooperative Ministries Created
OCTOBER – MOU's Created and Signed
NOVEMBER – Council of Councils Created
NOVEMBER/DECEMBER – Pastoral Care Staff Selected
JANUARY 2026 – Ministry Begins

THE PLAYERS:

CONGREGATIONS Ministry Co-ops can be large or small congregations, those currently with full-time staff as well as those in a pastoral vacancy or who typically have only part-time staff. Ministry Co-ops can also happen with Ecumenical partners as well as ELCA congregations. Ideally, there will be a handful of congregations within 30 or so minutes of one another.

PASTORS – ordained to Word and Sacrament

DEACONS- ordained to Word and Service

LAY MINISTERS – ongoing training and mentoring will be available

SOME OF THE BENEFITS OF MINISTRY CO-OPS:

The Ministry Co-ops promote vitality for all of the congregations by providing:

- A collective pool of resources to support full-time pastors and deacons, in a time of clergy shortage
- A training structure for lay ministers and interns allowing for a natural flow of trained leadership – some of whom may discern a call to public, rostered ministry
- A means for staff and members to practice teamwork in a familiar network as they will
 have to rely on one another to fully support and sustain ministry
- Built-in support for re-identifying values, mission, and community in the wake of an ever
 -changing landscape.
- A deeper and broader training and accountability structure for councils, officers, committees, staff, rostered ministers, and lay ministers.
- Insight into the Church universal as congregations partner together for the sake of the Gospel, reaching beyond their individual doors and into the broader community.
- Increased opportunities for worship, Bible study, small groups, service, fellowship, other faith practices.

OSLC Property Update

I am sure, if you have been in church the last few Sundays you have seen that the parking lot has been redone. Many cracks were first filled with tar and then two seal coats were applied. After the seal coats dried, the handicap spaces were moved to the center of the lot with signs (We are now ADA compliant!), then the parking lines were repainted. Boy does it look good now!

As reported last month, the bill for that was \$25,500. The council approved that expenditure with the hope of raising \$12,500 to add to funds already allocated in the CY25 church budget. Well, you all came through with flying colors because as of July 20th, \$19,050 has been contributed. A BIG thank you to all who contributed!

Our campus continues to need our care and the next project to tackle is our lawn/lawn watering system. The additional funds over the \$12,500 we needed will definitely help with this.

Again, thanks to all who contributed to the parking lot repair!



Thank you for your continued support of Grace Community Farm. We're growing, learning, and serving together—with your help!


