### **Our Apologies and a Happy Correction**


We owe a heartfelt apology for the mistake in last month's newsletter regarding Beatrice Smolenski.

# EASY PUMPKIN DUMP CAKE



- 15oz canned pumpkin puree
- · 12oz evaporated milk
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- · 3 large eggs
- · 2 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 15.25oz yellow cake mix
- · 1 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup unsalted butter, melted



Bake for 45-50 minutes, until the edges are browned and the center is set



### Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F.
- 2.Grease bottom and sides of a 9X13 inch cake pan.
- 3. In a large bowl combine the pumpkin, evaporated milk, brown sugar, eggs and pumpkin pie spice.
- 4. Whisk until combined.
  Pour this mixture into
  the greased pan.
- Sprinkle the cake mix powder on top of the batter as evenly as possible.
- 6. Sprinkle the pecans evenly over the batter.
- 7. Pour the melted butter evenly over the top of the cake.

# **GRACE COMMUNITY FARM**

Grace Farm has been very busy in the last few months. We had a great crop of zucchini and tomatoes this summer. The tomatoes are still producing but the zucchini are finished for the season and "Row 4" will be planted with broccoli. Additionally, we have planted a few more fruit trees this past month. You have probably admired the beautiful marigolds that are in full bloom.

On Saturdays we have begun having a Pop-Up produce stand with harvested produce available for donations. It begins at 10:00am until supplies last.

Our activities in the last few weeks included: a fun leaf-inspired art afternoon, fruit tree planting, compost workshop and a cooking demo where we learned how to make zucchini-tomatillo salsa and had veggie egg burritos.

We are looking forward to a special event on November 1st. We are expecting a large group to attend a Dia de los Muertos event featuring the marigolds grown on the farm. This event will be led by culinary anthropologist Dr. Claudia Serrato and will celebrate the cultural significance of the marigold within the Dia de los Muertos traditions honoring loved ones.

Volunteer hours at the farm include Wednesdays from 8:30am to 12:30pm and Saturdays 8:30am to 1:30pm. Join us by volunteering, or just come by to enjoy the comradery of the farm. We would love to see more OSLC members join us at the farm, even to just come by for a visit.
