Presidents Report

Wow the month of September just flew by and now we are in the fall season. I sure like the fact the weather has cooled down. How about you?

Kathleen and I made the trek to the Holy Land and Jordon the first part of September. It was an amazing trip seeing many of the sights where Jesus was and performed miracles along with a couple of sites from the Old Testament, specially where Moses died. We were with 29 fellow Lutherans from Minnesota plus 3 from California: Pastor Cheryl, Kathleen and myself. (Many of you maybe followed our trip from Pastor Cheryl's Facebook postings during the trip.) I must say Jerusalem is quite the city which is built on seven mountains and a history of over 3,000 years and considered holy to the Jews, the Muslims, and the Christians. Jerusalem is one of oldest cities in the world and has been destroyed at least twice, besieged 23 times, captured and recaptured 44 times, and attacked 52 times. We learned that today Israel is 80% Jewish, 20% Muslim, and only 2% Christian, and other dominations. Probably the most known building in Jerusalem is the Dome of the Rock with its gold dome and blue tiles. It is in the temple mount area of old Jerusalem controlled by the Muslims. (We were not able to get into Temple Mount as it was closed. We only could view it from a distance.) It is built over the" noble rock", which is considered holy by the Jews, Muslims, and Christians. For the Christians and Jews, it is considered the place where Abraham attempted to sacrifice his son. For the Muslims it is believed to be where the world was created along with where the night journey of Mohammed began. Of course, the amazing site we saw in Jordon was Petra (considered one of the seven modern wonders of the world), the Treasury. It is amazing how it was carved in sandstone thousands of years ago. I would definitely encourage you all, if you are thinking about making the trip there, to go.

I made contract with the Synod office just the other day to see if there was any progress on getting us a Pastor. They shared that they were looking at four possible candidates and that a couple of them are not in the area, so we would have to pay moving expense if they were a match. I shared that we would be able to do that. The Synod office will continue to work with us and Christ Lutheran. Continue to keep the process in your prayers. As I shared last month Jan Johnson continues coordinating supply Pastors for our Sunday worship. Thank you, Jan!

I was in contact with Elite Roofing just today and they are now set to start on reroofing. When talking with them and looking at the weather the plan is to start on October the 3rd. The job will take about three weeks. So, we should have a new roof by the end of the month. Oh, by the way we now have received \$25,300 for the reroofing. Thanks to all that have contributed!
