Faith is a lifelong journey. Sometimes, it seems, our journey is tough, but as we move along the path and spend time deepening our understanding of God and God's promises we are able to see the seeds that God has planted in our life and in the lives of those around us as we share our faith stories with one another. Matthew 13:1-9,18-23

¹That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat beside the sea. ²Such great crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat there, while the whole crowd stood on the beach. ³And he told them many things in parables, saying: "Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴And as he sowed, some seeds fell on the path, and the birds came and ate them up. ⁵Other seeds fell on rocky ground, where they did not have much soil, and they sprang up quickly, since they had no depth of soil. ⁶But when the sun rose, they were scorched; and since they had no root, they withered away. ⁷Other seeds fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. ⁸Other seeds fell on good soil and brought forth grain, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. ⁹Let anyone with ears listen!"

¹⁸Hear then the parable of the sower. ¹⁹When anyone hears the word of the kingdom and does not understand it, the evil one comes and snatches away what is sown in the heart; this is what was sown on the path. ²⁰As for what was sown on rocky ground, this is the one who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy; ²¹yet such a person has no root, but endures only for a while, and when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, that person immediately falls away. ²²As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the lure of wealth choke the word, and it yields nothing. ²³But as for what was sown on good soil, this is the one who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and yields, in one case a hundredfold, in another sixty, and in another thirty."

President's Message

Hey everybody it is now going on 16 months that we have been dealing with the COVID restrictions and now as of June 15 a majority of the restrictions have been eliminated. Therefore, your council has decided that church is now open. Masks are no longer required, although those that have not been vaccinated should still wear them for their protection. All the pew pads have been put back on the pews and all the rows are open. However, communion will still be done in the pews and sharing of the peace can be done with the peace sign. Hopefully and prayerfully you all are doing well and will return to church so that we can SHINE and share the light of Jesus Christ together.

Doing the service online using Facebook, ZOOM, or the church website has been very successful. We want to continue to offer this as we go back to in-church worship because it reaches people all across the country. To do the service online we have been using Pastor Jennifer's cell phone which has worked with a tripod in the center aisle. To get this out of the center aisle a study was done to see what is out there that could be mounted to the back of the church and have better quality. Brandon & Kristin Tolentino researched this looking at what other churches have done/are doing and have come up with a good solution. This will involve the purchase of a couple of cameras, new microphones, some mixing equipment, etc. The cost of this is estimated at \$14,000. Your council has approved this. Exact pricing and how it will all be installed in the church is now in progress. OSLC has received a grant from the Pacifica Synod of \$5,000 toward this effort, so the church needs to come up with the remaining \$9,000. Our treasurer, Bob Hunter, has looked at our budget and thinks we are good to go. But if any of you would like to contribute to this effort, please do so and mark it for **church online equipment**.

Your council approved the hiring of a new office administrator, Serene Flores. She starts on the July 5. Welcome to Serene. With the hiring of Serene, we all owe a big "Thank You" to Melissa Pool for serving as Interim Office Administrator for the past 19 months. Thank you, Melissa!

The gathering on Saturday June 19 saw about 12 people participating. It was a small group but always fun to get together. Some have suggested that we discontinue the gathering with the opening up of things, however, we will continue doing them for the time being. The next one is scheduled for July 17 from 5:30pm to 7pm. It would be great if you can make it.
