

Presidents Message

Well, we had May gray and June gloom weather and now we are having hot July and August weather. One must do all they are going to do in the morning outside before doing nothing in the afternoon because of the heat. Hope you are all staying cool and are having a good summer and able to take some vacation.

The Synod office has identified a Pastor that we could share as interim for both OSLC and Christ Lutheran. We have made initial contact with that Pastor as has Christ Lutheran. We now wait to hear back from the Synod to see if this person is up for the position. Hope they will be and then we will have to work out the particulars. Pray that this process goes well. In the meantime, as related in my July article we are continuing to utilize supply Pastors which Jan Johnson continues to coordinate. Thank you, Jan!

A one-year extension of the Covenant with Getsemani Apostolic Church (GAC) was signed. It covers the period August 1, 2023 through July 31, 2024. They will provide us \$2,288 per month as a utility offset. They are worshipping in Moreland Hall Saturday mornings and evenings along with bible study on Monday and Thursday evenings.

This past month all of the air filters for the 9 AC/furnaces were changed out. There are 19 filters which cost \$230. Also, the AC for the church (the 20-ton unit outside or known as Big Bertha as Bob Hunter calls it) was repaired as one of the blower units needed replacement. This cost just over \$1,500. Plus, the unit on the north roof over Moreland Hall was repaired. This repair is under warranty and we are working with the company that installed that unit in January of 2020 to get a replacement coil as that is the second time it has leaked out the freon.

As I reported a couple of months ago our church roof is in bad shape and needs replacement. We now have 3 cost estimates. One was for \$90,000, a second one was for \$86,800 and a third one was \$65,000. The problem with the \$65k estimate was that it does not include everything that is needed. If we would go with them a second contractor would be needed for the skylight replacement and the protection for the eves over the church atrium. After reviewing the estimates, the council decided we should proceed with the \$86,800 estimate from a company here in Orange, Elite Roofing. I worked with the guy who came out to measure and feel good about them as they are currently working at St. John's. Because that is a big number, the council unanimously agreed that we should go to the Mission Investment Fund (MIF), an arm of the ELCA to borrow the funds. (This is the same group that we obtained a loan from for the solar on the education building back in 2014.) Because of the size of the loan a congregational meeting is required for approval of the loan. Accordingly, you will be receiving a letter calling a congregational meeting on Sunday, August 6 after church to discuss and approve the loan. Of course, if any of you would want to contribute to the reroofing that would be awesome. Any funds received would result in a smaller loan needed for the project. In fact, we have received one gift of \$14,000 already, which means our loan now only needs to be \$72,800 versus the \$86,800. You can make a check out to the church and mark it for reroofing.

See you all in church on Sunday August 6th to discuss and approve the loan for reroofing.

Continue to keep the process for obtaining an interim Pastor with Christ Lutheran in your prayers.
