
Lent began the last Wednesday in February, Ash Wednesday, with 40 days of spiritual preparation for Easter (not counting Sundays). We are doing our traditional soup suppers on the 5 Wednesdays in March followed by the Holden Evening Prayer with Pastor John Embree leading us, (Thank you John for doing this!) Soup is at 6PM with the service at approximately 6:45PM. (Anyone who is interested in bringing soup, there is a signup sheet in the narthex.)

At the last council meeting which was held on the 16th of February, council members Steven Yoshizumi and Christine Garcia reported that they had met with the Bishop, Pastor Jennifer Schultz and two members of Christ Lutheran Church. Bishop Dave shared that he has an interim Pastor that could serve both churches. The one road block that has to be worked out is the Sunday church service time. We both have service on Sundays at 10AM. For us to share an Interim Pastor both churches will need to compromise on service time. The thinking is that one church will have service at 9AM and the other at 10:30AM. That will give the pastor 30 minutes to travel between the two churches which are 3 miles apart. The council agreed that our preferred service time would be 10:30AM. Christ Lutheran would then have their service at 9AM. However, if Christ Lutheran cannot work that then we would go to 9AM for our service and they would have theirs at 10:30. Steven and Christine will go back to the Bishop and Pastor Jennifer Schultz with that information and they will work that out with Christ Lutheran. If all goes well and an agreement can be made, we hope to have an interim Pastor shortly after Easter. Keep all this work in your prayers.

You all have probably noticed our new wrought iron fence between the church and the education building with a keyed gate for access. I think it turned out good and we now have a safety buffer for the preschool, so no homeless or wandering people can just walk into the class rooms which have doors that open to the outside. The access code for the keyed gate has been provided to all the preschool teachers and parents. Also, the office has the code as I do. If you need the code to access any part of the education building let me or the office know and we will provide it to you. As I shared last month in my article, the fence cost the church \$8,200. The \$8,200 not only covered the cost of the new fence but repair of the fence around the covered toddler play yard in front of Hansen Hall. The council authorized Bob to obtain a loan to pay for this from the Mission Investment Fund. To pay part of that amount I submitted a request to the Synod for a \$1,000 grant from the Warner Trust Fund. We will not know until mid-March if we will receive all or any of the \$1,000. If any of you might be interested in providing funds for the gate you can include it in your giving and mark it for the wrought iron fence.

Hope to see you all at the soup suppers as we travel the Lenten journey to Easter on April 9th.





Our Saviour's Children's Center
