President's Message

Christ is Risen! He is Risen indeed! Those are truly wonderful words. He not only forgives us but has given us eternal life. Hope you all had a very good Easter.

We thank Pastor John Embree for leading us in worship at our soup-suppers and Good Friday service. Not only was the soup and bread delicious on the Wednesday evenings but Pastor John's review of Luther's small catechism was really enlightening as I had forgot so much since I was in confirmation quite a few years ago. We Lutherans need to review and reinforce our beliefs in our Risen Christ. And I must say thank you to the confirmation band (Tommy on piano, Becket on flute, Laurie on guitar, and Pastor John on sax) for accompanying us for the hymns we sang on the Wednesdays.

We are continuing to work with Pastor Jennifer Schultz at the Synod office in obtaining a Pastor. She asked that we do a Ministry Site Profile (MSP)so that it can be posted on the ELCA web site for all possible Pastors to see. Your council took the MSP which was done back in 2018 and updated it adding some additional information. That MSP was approved by the council on March 25, 2024 and is now with the Synod. (If any of you would like see it, let me know and I can make you a copy or email it to you.) Pastor Jennifer is working all avenues for us to call a Pastor. Yes, in the meantime, we continue to utilize supply Pastors and have them set up now through June 9th which is the date we will be celebrating OSLC's 70th anniversary. The celebration is planned for Saturday June 8th where we will have a catered meal and program. Then on June 9th Bishop Dave Nagler will preach and we will have an anniversary cake after the service. Put June 8th and 9th on your calendar. More information will be provided as we get closer to that date.

The community garden project is going forward. To date \$13,300 has been given for the garden. The council has authorized an additional \$3,276 to be added to that for a fence to be built around the green area to the west of the shed by Moreland Hall. The fence installation is set to begin the first part of April. It should be completed by the end of April at which time that area will begin to be worked and planted. Yes, a lot of work to be done. We are partnering with CRECE Urban Farms who is running a community garden at a church in Santa Ana. See Nelly Walker's article on the garden project for more information. Also, if you have any questions about the garden, you may ask any council member along with Chris Kopczynski or Carol Yoshizumi.

Want to add a couple of reminders to this article concerning property. Please if you use Moreland Hall be sure to turn off **all** lights, including the patio lights if they are turned on, when you leave along with locking all doors. Also, if you see anyone dumping stuff in the church dumpster that is not related to the church or preschool, in particular tires, please let the church office know or myself as these are not taken by CR&R. It could cost the church up to \$50 a tire for their removal.

How do we respond to the spirit today? If we are God's hands and feet, how do we listen to the community around us? What are the needs of the community and how can we feel more connected?

These words are in contrast to the old question of "How do we get more butts in the seats?" We should ask ourselves: "How can we find a ministry that helps others in our community and invites people to join us in that ministry?"

A garden or an urban farm would turn an unused lot of land into a ministry that feeds the hungry and could also invite the community to our campus to participate with us. Making this dream a reality could help grow food for those in need and have an opportunity of fellowship and shared bonds that could help our congregation grow.

I believe there is a lot of interest in our surrounding community in gardening. I also believe many people would be attracted to the idea of helping those less fortunate via a gardening volunteer opportunity.

Since we are a small congregation which does not have a lot of farming experience, we have reached out to partner with Crece-Coop. Crece-Coop is a non-profit in Santa Ana that strives to create gardens and help those who are food insecure.

The garden would be developed in 2 or 3 phases, not all at once. It would include, vegetables, fruit trees, some raised bed planters, a garden for the preschool kids and a community gathering space.

With Crece-Coop's experience, we have a great amount of knowledge and assistance, however we will still need to apply for funding through grants, donations and other fundraising methods to finance the development.

Imagine: Our empty lot could turn into a wonderful ministry that grows food for those in need, such as the families assisted by the Friendly Center. Our empty lot has the possibility of community engagement and outreach. Our empty lot has the prospect of a ministry that could invite others to our property and grow our congregation.

A few months ago, Pastor Glen Eggertson ended his sermon with an inspiring challenge. He talked about having enough confidence in our faith to take risks in Jesus' name. Although by investing our time and effort into a garden, we may face some obstacles, but what better way to strengthen our faith than by nourishing our community?

Please join me in embracing this ministry opportunity together. Nelly Walker


Love swung at the first pitch and hit a single, because Love never fails.
